

## DENMEAD'S NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN – reporting back



The time for comments to be made on the Pre-Submission Plan has now expired. This document, which is a draft of the Plan, available in hard copy and on the website

[www.denmeadneighbourhoodplan.org.uk](http://www.denmeadneighbourhoodplan.org.uk) went public on 10th March 2014. The Steering Group are now considering the content of the 157 representations which came from residents, official consultees, landowners and developers.

Five public meetings were held in a four different locations within the village during the Pre-Submission Consultation period for the Denmead Neighbourhood Plan. The purpose of those meetings was to provide an exhibition of boards which set out the thinking behind the Plan and summarised the results of the extensive consultations held in the village during the last 22 months. Presentations at the five public meetings explained how views of the public and feedback from specialist independent Consultants and Agencies informed the selection of appropriate development sites.



The meetings all followed the same format, save for the last one when an independent Chairman was used to ensure that everyone who wanted to speak had the opportunity to ask whatever question[s] they wished. Although these questions were not part of the consultation process, they did enable points to be raised, clarified and answered as part of the information giving process. A record of those questions is available on the website as it may be of interest to those people who attended.

Representations were made formally through the DNP web-site, e-mail and by letter to the Clerk. Other comments made to the Steering Group were recorded and taken into account.

### What's happening now ?

Members of the Steering Group have already met with the Denmead War Memorial Hall Management Committee to examine a schematic layout allowing four houses to be built on part of the land at the site and what Hall users might gain from that arrangement.

The Steering Group has further considered the use of the Memorial Hall site and decided that taking all views into account that the Plan will not include any development on any part of the site – it is off the agenda.

Following up on the concerns of residents in Anmore Road a meeting has also been held with Officers from Hampshire Highways. The outcome of that can be summarised as “any rain that falls on any development site at Carpenter's Field will be dealt with by the sustainable drainage scheme that will be built into the site.” This will be good news for the people at the western end of Anmore Road because at present, in heavy rain, water runs off the field onto the road and floods it, running eastwards. The drainage work will ensure that that will no longer happen. Further meetings are planned with Hampshire Highways; the Environment Agency and Southern Water.

All representations, every one of them, are being considered by the Steering Group working with its independent planning Advisor, starting with a formal meeting on May 8th.

### The final version of the Plan

The Plan, with amendments that will come out of the work mentioned above, should have been completed by the end of May or early in June. Any changes will be explained to residents through an 'update' which will be delivered to every home in the Parish. It will be on the web-site and we will take steps to have further meetings. After that, the Plan will be passed to Winchester City Council to take the next step of scrutinising the Plan. A further six week consultation period is part of that process and residents may take part in that if they wish.

### And After That .....

Two more hurdles will need to be overcome. When Winchester City Council confirm the Neighbourhood Plan is fit for purpose it will be checked by an Independent Examiner. When that has been completed successfully, the Plan will go to a Referendum in Denmead, probably during the Autumn of 2014. 50% of the votes, plus 1, of those voting will mean that the Plan is approved and will become Planning Law for Denmead, alongside Winchester's Local Plan, Part 1.

## Since the last edition.... Notes from the Chairman's Diary

**10th March:** A meeting of the Denmead Business Forum was held this evening. It was the second of these events organised by Heidi Isa, who is Denmead's Village Centre Manager (with a business development role). It was an opportunity to meet informally and talk about their experiences and swap ideas. It was a pleasure to be able to welcome everyone and to experience the very positive response of those attending. During the evening Heidi conducted a SWOT analysis of the village shopping area and it was good to find that the strengths and opportunities far outweighed the weaknesses and threats. There were a number of suggestions for improving the retail centre and Heidi has already begun to take those up with the retailers and Parish Council.

**7th April:** The sharing of services is something which some local Parish Councils have been discussing recently. Denmead have been part of this, as we are increasingly aware that the budgets of the City and County Councils are continually being reduced and services stretched. It has become apparent to us that if we want action taken on some issues, then we will have to organise and fund it ourselves. Sharing the cost with other parishes could then make such a step a real possibility. As a result Tony Daniells, the Parish Clerk and I met with some HCC officers to find out the pros and cons of jointly employing an Accredited Community Support Officer. What might be achieved, in terms of having an officer working in Denmead for a couple of days or evenings a week, dealing with such matters as dog



fouling, litter and anti-social behaviour was positive but, of course, we will need to fund it. The Clerk and I will report our conversation to the next meeting of these local councils and a further

report will be made in a future Denmead Scene.

**8th April:** This year's Annual Parish Assembly had a different look and feel. The theme of welcoming organisations that the Parish Council work with and support, enabling them to talk to residents, and for residents to find out more, and decide to join in! Proved to be a success and it was encouraging that more people attended than the

previous year. Refreshments were prepared and served by members of the Denmead Activity Night's team (the junior youth club that runs at the Pavilion) who once more proved that these young people can be both good cooks and polite hosts. Thanks are due to the Coop for supporting this event.

The set-piece presentation of the Report on the work of the Council during the previous year, something which I, as Chairman, am duty bound to provide, was followed by the important task of allowing residents to hold councillors at all levels to account. This was done through a 'Question Time' debate, run by Cllr Karen Forster, which proved a worthwhile way to complete the evening. As they left some people even commented that it was the best Assembly they had attended for some time!

**19th April:** It was another pleasant duty today, to be able to support



Denmead's first 'Chicken Run'. This was an Easter-Egg hunt and is described in another article in this edition. It was a pleasure for some of the Councillors (Cllrs Reed, Scholey and myself) to be present at different times during the day, to join with Heidi Isa and (both from WCC) to welcome the families as they returned, help to mark the answers and hand out the prize chocolate eggs. It was an added bonus that many of the families, particularly new to Denmead, learnt more about the village as they followed the trail. The weather was kind and so everyone enjoyed themselves, as you can read over the page.

**23rd April:** Regular readers of the Denmead Scene will know that there is always a mention of the Denmead Neighbourhood Plan in every edition, often in this column.

Today saw the end of the period during which



representations could be made to the Steering Group about the Pre-Submission Plan. In all there were 157 representations from statutory

consultees, the City Council, residents and developers. Work is continuing in assessing those responses but at the time of writing this is not yet completed, however some announcements can be made and these are included in the front page article of this edition.

I can happily report that the DCA have had a successful start to 2014 regarding grants, donations and goodwill, in the support of our Program of Sustainability and Refurbishment. Receiving 50% match funding from HCC under the Community Building Capital Scheme we have replaced the windows in the Annexe, they were supplied and fitted by Town & Country Window Systems Ltd who are based locally in the Village and kindly upgraded the windows to toughed safety glass. This year's Parish Council Grant is going towards the refurbishment of the Main Hall, including decoration and professional cleaning of curtains. The DCA also invested in an industrial dishwasher from a grant from Cllr Patricia Stallard. Finally we received news we have been successful in securing a grant from Awards for All to fully finance the overhaul of the ladies, disabled and courtyard toilets. All in all a great team effort which has made sufficient inroads towards our aim to leave a lasting legacy for the village.

This year's Proms in the Park are on the evening on the 12th July. The Denmead Brass will be supported by both the Training Band and the Pompey Pluckers - Portsmouth's very own ukulele group. This live open-air concert promises to be one of the village highlights of the summer. One event for special mention is that we have again booked one of the best bands in this area – 'FAY WRAY'.

This year, we are raising money for the charities of 'Hannah's Holiday Home Appeal (HHHA)' and 'Myeloma UK'.

HHHA was set up in memory of a fun and wonderful little girl and offers breaks to families and children with life threatening illnesses. At the age of 8, Hannah was diagnosed with Hodgkin's Lymphoma. Sadly after a year of treatments Hannah passed away peacefully at home, aged just 10. Whether undergoing treatment, recovering from or sadly coping with bereavement, Hannah's Holiday Home Appeal offers a FREE break :- Monday to Friday or Friday to Monday, which is for all the family. The luxurious holiday homes are on wonderful family holiday villages, which offer a great variety of facilities and can cater for up to a family of 6.

Myeloma is a cancer arising from an abnormality in the plasma cells, a type of white blood cell which is made in the bone marrow. It doesn't exist as a lump or tumour, but can affect multiple places of the body. One of the locals to the Harvest Home is Steve Rowley (perhaps better known as 'Elvis'). He has performed many times around the area, and has done so several times at our event in previous years. Unfortunately, Steve now suffers from Myeloma, and so supporting this charity is close to everyone's thoughts.

The event will start from the Harvest Home Public House in Denmead at approx. 10:00 am.

There are 3 routes available. The shortest is 10 miles long towards Clanfield, the Bat & Ball Public House, then south back to Denmead. The 2nd route is 20 miles and follows the 10 mile route to the Bat & Ball pub, where it then heads into Hambledon village, turns right towards Hoe Cross and Newtown, and wends its way back to Denmead via the Chairmakers Arms. The 3rd route of 35 miles, is really quite challenging, and primarily for the fitter ones amongst us. This basically follows the 20 miler with an extra loop that takes in Winchester Hill and Brockbridge, and then a second loop that sweeps through Soberton. These extra loops will take the riders past some spectacular scenery and countryside.

The event is open to anybody of any age and ability, and is definitely not a race. The idea is to primarily have fun and to raise money for a good

and deserving cause. Individuals can do this through sponsorship forms, but just turning up and/or taking part will help boost finances. Back at the Harvest Home, after the cycling, will be several other activities, namely a BBQ, raffle, tombola and auction and several entertainers (including FAY WRAY) performing throughout the afternoon and early evening. Hopefully, there will also be some 'fun and games' organised in the field opposite the pub.

## OUR SAFER NEIGHBOURHOOD PANEL

Every three months a meeting is held in the Community Centre at Denmead to review what has happened in the parish over the previous period concerning crime, anti-social behaviour, and other safety issues affecting the community. Called the Safer Neighbourhood Panel, it is chaired by a parish councillor, currently Ian Reed, and has attendance from other councillors, the Police, Winchester Community Safety and Neighbourhood Watch. The meeting is also shared with Hambledon, and is a public meeting, so anyone with interests or concerns about safety issues in the parishes can and should attend.

The Police are represented by one or more members of the Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) based in Bishops Waltham, responsible for both Denmead and Hambledon. The West of Waterlooville area is included in their beat area as well, both Dukes Meadow (Old Park Farm) and Berewood, so activity in those areas is covered as well. The current SNT members with responsibilities locally are Sergeant Stuart Gilmour, PC Sarah Newman and PCSO Amey Stevens, while an additional PCSO, Rebecca Williams, has recently joined the team with particular responsibility for the West of Waterlooville. The Police brief the Panel on recent criminal activity, anti-social behaviour, any other problems, and their own actions, and there is the opportunity for all other attendees to comment or add their individual concerns, observations and requests.

Winchester are normally represented by the Head of Community Safety, Sandra Tuddenham as well as a member of the Neighbourhood Services Team, who has special responsibility for the Southern Parishes, including our area, and is also the lead on fly tipping where encouraging prosecutions have now started. Community Safety liaise effectively with a wide range of partnership members and are active in taking up local issues concerning safety and well being that affect us all.

Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) aims to give the view of the general public with Brian Turner from Denmead, Geoffrey Hartridge from Hambledon and other members when available. Denmead Neighbourhood Watch works alongside the Police SNT and so covers the West of Waterlooville as well, with an increasing number of NHW schemes in the Old Park Farm area where anti-social behaviour was causing concern but is now showing some reduction.

The primary outcome of these meetings is to allocate Policing Priorities for the SNT for both Denmead and Hambledon for the next three

months. At the same time actions are allocated to other members in areas where safety concerns have been raised.

If you have concerns or queries about any aspect of safety and security in the Parish, do try and come along to one of these meetings. They start at 2pm in the afternoon, which is not convenient for those at work, so if this restricts you please let the Deputy Clerk, Kelvin Andrews, know in good time what you would like to raise on 02392 247 947 (dclerk@denmeadparishcouncil.co.uk) and we will bring it up at the meeting and get you a response.

The next meetings of the Panel are on Thursday 17 July and 16 October. If you have an issue we hope to see you there or at least hear from you.

## Exhibition of Family Memories of World War 1

100 years ago, WW1, the war to end all wars, began. The suffering and horrors are well documented as well as the military campaigns.



However, in association with the church and the church flower club, we would like to remember and recognise the contributions made by ordinary

people, particularly the people of Denmead.

On Saturday 2nd and Sunday 3rd August we are holding an exhibition of memorabilia, memories and accounts of people who were alive at that time in the church hall. The flower club will also be putting on a display in the church.

We are looking for contributions to the exhibition. Photographs, items from that time and, of course,

stories would be very welcome. They don't have to be about any military personnel – stories about people going about their daily lives, VAD's, people who worked on the farms and in the factories would all be very interesting.

I have a story that I will be including about my great uncle, who, having fallen out with his brother, joined up at the age of 18 and was killed in Ypres, 3 months later. The sad part of this is that he was in a restricted trade as he was an engineer in an armaments factory in Coventry and did not need to go. His brother (my grandfather) never forgave himself and my father was named after him. We have a photograph but nothing else as his medals got lost over time, but I was able to track down his grave stone in one of the military cemeteries. ### Denmead Chicken Run – a Cracking Success!

On Easter Saturday, 155 children from Denmead and the surrounding villages took part in the very first Denmead Chicken Run. The objectives of the event were to get people out and about in the fresh air, promote some of the many organisations in the village and raise some money for charity. Happily all 3 of these objectives were achieved. Children (and their parents) were sent on a walking trail around Denmead and asked to look out for large papier maché eggs in certain locations. Each of these clusters of eggs had been made by a different Denmead organisation including the brownies, the WI Belles and Denmead Youth Partnership. With each cluster was a little plaque of information about the organisation and a picture of an animal. Older children had to read the information on the plaque to answer questions on their trail, while younger children were asked to name the animal or its colour or sound.

The trail began at Kidmore Lane car park, went all the way around the King George V playing fields, back to the shops on Hambledon Road and then ended in All Saints Church Hall where correct answer sheets were rewarded with a chocolate egg. Children were also asked to add their

names and decoration to a giant egg which had been made by the scouts. The scouts provided refreshments and a raffle in order to raise money for their participation in the World Jamboree in Japan next year.

You may also have noticed paper eggs decorating the windows of shops in the village. These were all designed by Denmead Infant and Junior School children and the best one in each year group was rewarded with a chocolate Easter egg.

The event was organised by Market Towns Development Officer, Heidi Isa, and was made possible thanks to the generosity of 8 local businesses whose sponsorship covered the cost of the hall hire and the printing



of the trails. The chocolate prizes for each participant were kindly donated by the Coop, as were the prizes for the shop window eggs.

Heidi and the Parish Council would like to thank all of the sponsors; all of the organisations who made the eggs; the scouts who made the giant egg and of course all of the mums and dads who accompanied their children on the Chicken Run.
